

NLO Shorts: An Introduction to the Orchestra



The Percussion

As you are watching the videos, answer the questions below. If you're unsure about spellings, turning on subtitles might help! Some keywords are given to guide your answers to some questions.

1. Draw a diagram showing where the five sections of the orchestra sit. [1]
Strings | Wind | Brass | Percussion | Horns
2. What is the most common percussion instrument called? What is its range? (You can answer in note-names or by drawing a staff. Hint: use the YouTube subtitles if you're not sure which notes are being played!) [3]
3. Listen carefully to the extract from Julius Eastman's *Femenine* (1:44). How many different pitches does the vibraphonist play? [1]
4. How did Benjamin Britten achieve the sound of raindrops in *Noye's Fludde* (2:58)? [3]
5. Listen carefully to the extract from Stevie Wonder's *Superstition* (3:50). Name two percussion instruments played either by the drummer, or the backing singers. [2]
