- 1. What type of tuba usually plays in an orchestra? [1] Tenor | Bass | Contrabass
- 2. What is the lowest note on a tuba? (Answer in note-names or by drawing a stave. Hint: use the subtitles if you're not sure which notes are being played!) [1]
- Listen carefully to the extract from Mussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition (1.12). What might be a suitable dynamic for this passage? [1] Piano | Mezzo-forte | Forte
- 4. Why does the tuba sit near the cellos and double basses? [2]
- 5. Listen carefully to the extract from *Doctor Jazz* (2.44). What is the texture of this extract? [1]

Monophonic (one solo line) | Polyphonic (multiple independent lines) | Melody and accompaniment (one melody line with one or more accompanimental lines)
